In some cases, especially when something is happening, the audience is "curious." Gathering several people in one place creates a mass, and whoever these people are a scientist or an ordinary worker - they immediately lose their observation and intelligence. Thus, the artist wants to show that each person has their own independent opinion, that joining different groups and bad negative trends ends in tragedy. This means that a person's own views and independent thinking about things and events, the essence of what is happening in society expand the limits of his ability to know and understand.

That is, drawing the unique moments of nature, he takes you into its mysterious world and gives peace and tranquility to our souls.
